We have now completed our 29<sup>th</sup> year of ministry here on Ball Hill. What a journey it has been. We have experienced the blessings and bumps of being a beloved community in Christ. I am thankful for God's unrelenting hope and love for us. He never gives up leading us toward life. In every season together we have experienced His faithfulness.


Throughout this conference year we have seen a decline in attendance which has stirred consideration of our focus and priority. I believe our calling to make disciples must move beyond our attention to Sunday morning worship. Who we are as Christ followers must be reflected in standing apart from our world and yet being made one with it. In contemplation we discover space separate from the world that allows us to see it and ourselves clearly. We then must courageously release all that clouds our vision and suffocates the breath of God. This clarity frees us to step into the breach of our world with the hope of reconciliation, the restoration of life and the love of Christ. This refocus will call each of us to invest in listening well, deep relationship and loving service.

We have been experiencing what feels more like a fictional novel rather than reality, but here we are, nonetheless. The 2020 theme, "Walk the Way" is shaping our hearts and calling us to pay attention to what I believe are the essential qualities to equip us to navigate the challenges of what is happening in our world and the call of the church to be present in the midst of it. Seeing clearly is the path of spiritual discipline to journey into an experience with Christ that grows emotional maturity, deep spirituality and true identity. Following closely is leaning into obedience to serve the purpose and ways of Christ. This is a matter of engaging with our world in what we are uniquely called and qualified to accomplish. Walking the Way is allowing the gospel to have its effect in every part of life.

- We baptized Dylan Hawkins in July.
- Tent meeting speaker was Rev. Steven Dunmire with Michael Farrow providing the music.
- We installed stained glass panels in the sanctuary and covered "The Good Shepherd" mural with a fabric panel and cross along with many other small projects to maintain our buildings.
- Season of monthly men's fellowship breakfasts
- Dylan Hawkins was sent on a short term mission trip to Lebanon. We hosted the Chili Cook off in February to support the work of Youth for Christ Lebanon.
- Our Christmas music program looked a little different this year with a variety of participants with narration written by Rev. Patricia Ellis.
- We created and hired an assistant staff position
- We developed our online presence with our website, including online giving and streaming of our worship services.
- Throughout the first 4 months of COVID-19 we provided: morning reflections Monday through Friday, Tuesday Bible study with Zoom, Wednesday Prayer with Zoom, Thursday Live Worship with Facebook, Friday Communion with Zoom, Saturday Adult Sunday School with Zoom and Sunday Children's Sunday School with Zoom and Worship with Facebook Live.
- Fulfilled pastoral care responsibilities and endeavored to live as a disciple of Jesus Christ.

The next pastoral call/review will be completed in 2021 with the District Superintendent and the L.B.A.


